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

Year Two have been thinking about what bullying is and how they should respond if they see bullying behaviour taking place. In groups, the children acted out a range of scenarios and made freeze frames at different points of the action. The groups performed to each other and pupils were asked to consider the following:

- 1) What was happening in the scene?
- 2) What could the person who was being hurt/bullied do about the situation?
- 3) What the person watching (the *bystander*) was thinking?
- 4) What could the bystander do in each situation?

Facts About Bullying

It doesn't just happen once; it goes on over time and happens again and again.

It is deliberate: hurting someone on purpose, not accidentally.

It is unfair: the person doing the bullying may be older, stronger or more powerful (or there are more of them) and even if the bully is enjoying it, the person being bullied is not.
